### About the area

#### Abbotsford<sup>1</sup>

- is one of the largest cities in British Columbia outside Vancouver, Victoria, and Kelowna
- is known as "the city in the country"

### The Fraser Valley Regional District

- is in the province of British Columbia
- includes the municipalities of Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Mission, Harrison Hot Springs, Hope, and Kent

#### The province of British Columbia

- borders the province of Alberta, the Pacific Ocean, and Washington state in the United States of America
- is one the most diverse provinces in Canada
- has a large immigrant population

Abbotsford has <u>warm summers</u> with an average daily high temperature of 24°C in July and moderate winters with an average daily low of -1°C in January.

## Living, working and going to school

The Fraser Valley region is an ideal place to work, raise a family, do business, and study. The Fraser Valley region is a major agriculture centre of British Columbia, which means there many types of businesses like farms, orchards, and fishing vessels.

As of June 2023, the official minimum wage in British Columbia is \$16.75 an hour.

Housing costs vary. The <u>average price to buy a single-family house</u> is approximately \$1,600,000. <u>Renting a 2-bedroom apartment</u> costs approximately \$1,400 per month.

There are many <u>schools</u>, daycares, and after-school programs. In Canada, students usually go to school from kindergarten (age 3 or 4) to grade 12 (age 17 or 18). After that, they can go to college or university or start working.

- Justice Institute of British Columbia

There are also many <u>colleges</u> where you can study in British Columbia. The following are within 100 kilometres driving distance from Abbotsford

- Nicola Valley Institute of Technology

You can play many types of sports, like
